SCHEDULE

Check in will be at the range at 8:00 am to 9:00 am., May 24th. Registration Packets will be available for pick up at this time.

Competition will start at 9:00 am.

Range officers will fire on Saturday May 23rd.

Award ceremony for both the Cameron Cup and the Triple Cup Challenge will be at 3:00 pm.(Aprox.)

ENTRY LIMIT

Entries shall be limited to the first hundred and thirty (130) individuals. Entries will be on a first come basis.

DIVISIONS

Competitors may register as an individual into the following divisions. See Section 3 of the rulebook for details.

Competitors may register as an individual into the following classifications. See Section 19 of the rulebook for details. NRA Classification System (you must have a valid NRA Action Pistol Classification card or Temporary Classification book or you will Shoot in Master Class-Unclassified

TARGETS

Rule 4.2: NRA AP-1 cardboard targets will be used on the paper events. Rule 4.3: 8" diameter round steel plates, .375" thick will be used in the Falling Plate Event.

COMPETITOR'S DUTIES:

Competitors may be required to act as range safety officers / observers for alternate relays

SQUADDING

Competitors may squad when entering on line, however changes can be made at the discretion of match staff to improve efficiency and operations. Competitors packets at registration will have the final squads and shooting times.

SCHEDULE OF EVENTS

The NRA Action Pistol Shooting Rules, Official Program, and Match Director's Bulletin shall govern the Regional and Triple Cup Challenge.

SAFETY

All competitors will observe firearms safety practices. Safety violations in side matches will result in disqualification from all side matches, not from the Championships.

EYE AND EAR PROTECTION

Everyone is required to wear eye and ear protection in and around the firing line. Eye and ear protection are available for purchase in the Vendor area.

MEDICAL EMERGENCY

Report any medical emergency immediately to the Championship Officials or range personnel.

FIREARMS INSPECTION

Random draw will determine the inspection of firearms. It is the competitors responsibility to make sure the proper firearm and equipment for the Division entered is followed. I the competitor has a question about equipment meet with the Referee.

GROUND COVER

The Green Valley Rifle and Pistol Club shall provide ground cover (i.e. shooting mats).

SCORING

All paper Targets will be scored in the Central Scoring Area. Competitors shall report to the area thirty (30) minutes after they complete an event to review targets and score card. If the competitor agrees, sign the card. Please do not wait until the end of day to check your targets, this has cost serious delays in the past for both the competitor and other competitors as well as delaying the awards ceremony. The use of the plug-type scoring gauge will be restricted to use by Official Referees only.

Scoring in event IV will take place at the rear of the stage. Steel must fall to score.

TIES

In events I, II, and III ties will be broken following Rule 15.2. In event IV, ties will be broken following Rule 15.12.

CHALLENGES

If a competitor feels that a shot fired by himself or by another competitor has been improperly evaluated or scored they may challenge the ruling.

The competitor must make the challenge prior to signing the scorecard. If it is another competitor's target, then the competitor must make the challenge at least thirty (30) minutes after the conclusions of that days firing.

For challenging statistical errors, the challenge time shall expire at one hour after last shot fired or 30 minutes after the scores are posted.

Challenge Fee

Competitors Target \$10

Another Competitors Target \$20

If the competitor's challenge is sustained at any point along the line of rechecks, the challenge fee will be returned. If the challenge is lost, the challenge fee will be included in the general revenue of the event.

The decision of an NRA Official Referee shall be final. See Rule 11.2 and Section 16 of the rulebook for details.

PROTESTS FILING PROCEDURE

A competitor must initiate a protest immediately upon the occurrence of the protested incident. Failure to comply with the following procedure will automatically void the protest:

- (1) State the complaint orally to the Chief Range Officer. If not satisfied with his decision then,
- (2) State the complaint orally to an Official Referee. If not satisfied with his decision then,
- (3) Obtain a protest form from the Chief Referee; complete the protest in writing stating all facts in the case. File the protest with the Chief Referee within two (2) hours of the protested incident. A protest fee of \$50.00 must accompany the written protest
- (4) The Championships Protest Committee will call a meeting to rule on the protest. The protesting competitor should be prepared to appear before the Protest Committee if requested to do so.
- (5) Decisions made by the Championships Protest Committee are final.

If the Protest Committee sustains the protest, then the competitor will receive a refund. If the Protest Committee denies the protest, then the competitor will not receive a refund and it will transfer to the general revenue of the Championships. See Section 17 for details.
